With the third event of **The Art of Exposing Injustice** series we aim to question the idea that providing information and revealing facts have just become arbitrary, posing attention to the role of citizens to expose abuses of governments, institutions and corporations, and the work of practitioners to build up tools to facilitate this process.

By being conscious that information has always been a construction, and despite the many attempts of influencing opinions via political propaganda and marketing strategies, we aim to highlight the power of citizens and grassroots realities in exposing facts, focusing on the impact of collective actions to reveal wrongdoing, and the collaborative production of social justice.

What is the role of citizens in this scenario and how can we still contribute in making a change in the information sphere? Going beyond the usual dichotomy between journalists and activists, official media and independent media, we aim to open up a dialogue among different expertise, inviting investigative journalists, writers, hackers, researchers and activists to discuss and present opportunities of collaboration, becoming allies to report misinformation, corruption, abuse, power asymmetries and injustice.
